SCHOOL GOALS 2023-2024

Academic Excellence

- Increase school-wide student proficiency in the STAR Math from 37% to 47% by May of 2024.
- Increase school-wide student proficiency in STAR Reading from 35% to 45% by May of 2024.
- Increase student proficiency on the MCAP assessments by 10% from SY22-23 to SY 23-24.

Equity

- Reduce suspensions by 30% during school-year 2024.
- Reduce monthly office referrals in Pre-K 2 from beginning of the year to the end of the year.
- Increase the percentage of students feeling safe according to the student wholeness survey from 78% to 88% by June 2024.

Bright Future

- 80% of students referred to mental/health services receive sustained services.
- Increase school-wide attendance from 92% 93% by June 2024.
- Decrease chronic absenteeism from 24% to 14% by June 2024. \rightarrow

PPPCS PHONE POLICY- YONDR

What if I want to reach my child during the school day?

We want our students to be engaged in their learning. If you need to contact your child during the school day, contact the main office at (410) 558-1230.

What if there is a school emergency?

In case of a school emergency, we direct our students to safety first, following our school emergency preparedness protocol.

Will my student's phone be safe?

Students are in possession of their phone - in their Yondr pouch - for the entire school day. We will advise students to store the pouch in their lockers (Middle School) or backpack where it is completely safe. PPPCS is not responsible for damaged or missing phones.

What if the Yondr pouch gets damaged or a student is caught on their phone?

The Yondr pouch is property of Patterson Park Public Charter School. If a student damages their pouch or is caught on their phone, Administration will collect the phone/pouch and contact home:


- 1st Occurence:
 - Student will receive a referral
 - Guardians will be required to come to the school for a conference and to pick up their child's phone.
 - Students will turn in their phone daily to school administration for one week following the incident.
- Repeat Occurrence: If this behavior is repeated, all steps will be followed above as well as a conference with administration to determine a plan to ensure proper implementation of the school policy and alignment to the Baltimore City Schools Code of Conduct.

Note: Damage consists of any signs that the physical integrity of the pouch has been compromised, whether intentional or unintentional, as determined by the school.
